• Girls' Hostel:

Considering the qualitative performance of the college, the students from remote places in Maharashtra demanded the special facilities for girls. As per their demand, the college provides Girls' Hostel. The Girls' Hostel in the College was established in 2012-13 having 38 rooms and 90 students in-take capacity. The hostel has 1 bed (04 rooms) 2 beds (14 rooms), 3 beds (9 rooms, Guest rooms (08) with attached washroom. For the safety and security of the girls, precautions are taken by the management. There is a doctor, a lady rector, and a lady housekeeping staff. Girls' hostel is equipped with solar heater system, study hall, kitchen and office, floor wise washrooms, floor wise intercom facility, indoor games facility, and internet facility.




