c) Various departments of the College were encouraged for signing of MOUs and creating Linkages with industries for research, internships and placement of students.


d) Supporting students for getting various Government, Non-government, private scholarships and financial support.

1. How much of the syllabus was covered in the class for the academic year 2022-23 287 responses










13. What percentage of teachers use ICT tools while teaching? 287 responses


